Mr. Mark Vale, CHIEF INFORMATION AND PRIVACY OFFICE, GOVERNMENT OF ONTARIO

Mark Vale was appointed the first Chief Information and Privacy Officer for the Ontario Ministry of Government Services in July 2006. Before joining the Ontario Public Service, Mark Vale was President of Information Management & Economics, Inc. helping governments and companies across Canada more effectively man-

age information and knowledge resources. Mr. Vale is an information economist with more than 25 years experience in information policy, strategy and planning, and implementing corporate information and knowledge management programs. He is one of North America's leaders in shaping the information and knowledge man-

agement disciplines and has taught at the University of Alberta, York University, Stanford University and California State University. Born in Toronto, Mark Vale received his MA in economics from the University of California, Berkeley and his Ph.D. from Stanford University
